LGBT History Month is celebrated from October 1-October 31. LGBT History Month is an annual month-long observance of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender history and the history of gay rights and related civil rights movements. Rodney Wilson is credited with creating Gay History Month. A high school teacher at Mehlville High School in suburban St. Louis, Wilson became the first openly gay K-12 teacher in the state of Missouri in 1994 when he came out to his history class during a lesson about the Holocaust. He explained that if he had lived in Germany during World War II, he likely would have been imprisoned and murdered by the Nazis for being gay. October was selected as Gay History Month because schools are in session, and it is the month in which the first national march for lesbian and gay rights occurred and National Coming Out Day is celebrated.

schools and libraries and often books by and about our LGBTQIA+ community are impacted. We have seen this in the Central York School District book ban that made national news in 2021 when the School Board banned books designed as teacher resources with a variety of topics, including books by and for the LGBTQIA+ community. According to PEN America, 41% of banned books at libraries have LGBTQIA+ themes.

NPR states there has been a 33% increase in the number of books being banned across the United States. But polling by NPR/Ipsos finds that 64% of American oppose book banning by School Boards, and 69% oppose book bans by state legislatures.

What can we do to stand against this?

- Register to vote and vote for candidates who oppose book bans. (last day to register to vote in PA is Monday, October 23, 2023)
- 2. Attend school board meetings and stand up for free speech.
- 3. Read banned books and share with friends and family.


